## Governor's Awards Dinner

Consider attending the Governor's Awards Dinner to be held at the lovely Chevy Chase Club located a short car ride from the USUHS meeting site. Cocktails will be followed by a dinner in the Chevy Chase Club Ballroom. At \$49 per attendee, this is a partially subsidized, delicious meal prepared for the enjoyment of meeting attendees.

## Associates' Activities

There will be sessions on Saturday devoted to poster and podium presentations by Associates of the DC metropolitan area. Poster presentations will include clinical vignettes and research abstracts. Podium presentations will be limited to scientific research. Each program director will select his/her program's best research abstract for presentation from the podium. Cash awards will be given to the top four podium presentations. Also, the first-place winner will have his/her abstract submitted for entrance into the national competition held at Internal Medicine, formerly Annual Session, in San Diego. DC ACP will contribute \$500 towards travel expenses for this Associate to attend the national competition in San Diego. Information regarding the abstract presentations can be directed to the program director of the Associates' training program or to Gayle Klein at 301-229-9647. **Deadline for submissions is October 9, 2006.**

Also, Associates are invited to attend general scientific sessions of the DC ACP meeting free of charge (both on Friday afternoon and on Saturday). In particular, Associates are encouraged to attend the Clinical Pathological Conference presentation by Arthur Weinstein, MD, FACP, which will be held between the Associate poster and podium sessions.

## Pathways to Fellowship

Attendance at chapter meetings can help all ACP members meet the qualifications for advancement to Fellowship. It is especially important for those applying under the pathway that calls for 5 years of activity as a Member.

## Clinical Pathological Conference (CPC)

This year there will be two CPCs, one on Friday afternoon and one on Saturday morning. The Friday afternoon CPC will be a Historical CPC presented by Philip Mackowiak, MD, FACP, a former Governor of the Maryland ACP Chapter and a local "legend" known for his CPC presentations that explore the causes of death for various historical figures. Dr. Mackowiak has graciously agreed to share one of his historical CPCs with us.

The Saturday morning CPC will be a more "traditional" CPC presented by Arthur Weinstein, MD, FACP. Dr. Weinstein was selected as a Top Doctor from the Washington Hospital Center by *Washingtonian Magazine* in July 2005, and we are fortunate to have him join us for our meeting.

## Directions

### To USUHS

From Capital Beltway (coming from the west): Take Exit 34, Route 355, South, Wisconsin Avenue toward Bethesda in left lane. Cross Cedar Lane (3rd light). Shortly thereafter, turn left into National Naval Medical Center. Follow ACP signs to the meeting.

From Capital Beltway (coming from the east): Take Exit 33, Route 185/Connecticut Avenue southbound toward Chevy Chase/Kensington. Merge onto MD 185 South (Connecticut Avenue), and travel 0.4 miles to Jones Bridge Road. Turn right onto Jones Bridge Road, and travel 1.1 miles to Wisconsin Avenue/Rockville Pike. Turn right onto Wisconsin Avenue/Rockville Pike. At first light, turn right into National Naval Medical Center. Follow ACP signs to meeting.

From DC on Connecticut Avenue (coming from the south): Drive north away from DC. Approximately 2 miles north of Chevy Chase Circle, turn right onto Manor Road. At light, turn left onto Jones Bridge Road. Cross Connecticut Avenue and continue to Wisconsin Avenue/Route 355. At first light, turn right into main gate of National Naval Medical Center. Follow ACP signs to meeting.

From DC on Massachusetts Avenue (coming from the south): Turn north on Wisconsin Avenue/Route 355. Take Wisconsin Avenue approximately 5 miles. After passing Jones Bridge Road intersection, travel short distance further on Wisconsin Avenue and then turn right into main gate of National Naval Medical Center. Follow ACP signs to meeting.

The nearest Metro stop is Red Line, Medical Center. Cross Rockville Pike and enter National Naval Medical Center main gate and follow ACP signs (there is a significant walk from the gate to the meeting site).

**Note:** The only entrance available to those attending the ACP meeting will be the Wisconsin Avenue entrance. The Jones Bridge Road entrance is not available to meeting attendees.

### To Chevy Chase Club

(6100 Connecticut Avenue, Chevy Chase, MD; 301-656-6323)

**From Capital Beltway:** Follow Capital Beltway (Route 495) to Exit 33, Connecticut Avenue (Route 185) southbound toward Chevy Chase. Go south on Connecticut Avenue for just under 2 miles, at which point you will cross Bradley Lane (Route 191). Immediately after crossing Bradley Lane, take first right into Chevy Chase Club.

**From District of Columbia:** Go north on Connecticut Avenue from Chevy Chase Circle (Chevy Chase Circle is where Western Avenue meets Connecticut) for about 0.3 miles until just before you reach Bradley Lane (Route 191). Take left from Connecticut Avenue just before Bradley Lane into Chevy Chase Club.
